

May I Introduce You To......

As the Director of Stewardship and Resource Development, I have one of the longer titles in the Eastern Synod. But even that lengthy title doesn't quite cover the variety of projects I get to work on during the one day per week my agreement calls for.

"Stewardship" is the traditional word we use to describe all aspects of giving to the church. Over the past few years I've begun to see that through the lens of generosity. My job in this area is to assist congregations to encourage their members to embrace the habits of generous giving as a response to God's generous gifts to us.

At times I've blogged extensively on this subject. More recently I've been offering a workshop called Nurturing Generous Giving to cluster groups of congregational leaders. In 2012-13 there have been 8 workshops, offered from London to Sudbury to Lunenburg and a few places in between, with a total of 166 participants. These have been tremendously rewarding, as I've watched people implement ideas they learned at the workshop back in their own congregation.

From time to time I am asked to consult with leaders from a single congregation or church camp who wonder what they can do to increase giving income. And occasionally I'm asked to speak at a congregation's Stewardship Sunday.

Resource development is the part of the job which is focused on encouraging congregations to be generous in their giving to benevolence, which is how local expressions contribute to support the work of synodical, national and international expressions of the church. My work includes producing material that helps interpret the wider church to people who understand their own congregation but don't know much about the ministry of the Eastern Synod or ELCIC.

And then there are the "other duties as assigned". They include organizing the annual banquet of the Bishop's Company for Mission, facilitating planning sessions for synod committees, coordinating materials for the Synodical Covenant, and anything else that I can do to help the bishop.

My biggest surprise of 2013 has been observing how fiercely independent some congregations are. In response to the Covenant and to ideas about reforming the benevolence system, churches have let us know that they will not readily cede control of their affairs to the Synod or anyone else. In the dance between congregations and the rest of the church, congregations lead!

In 2014 I'm looking forward to working with Pastor Riitta Hepomaki on planning and delivering a number of workshops for congregational councils. We believe that many congregations would like some suggestions on how to make council work more effective for the church and satisfying for the members.
