PSALMODY / WORD

GOSPEL: John 11:17, 33-44 / Psalm 139:1, 13-16
Assembly is invited to sit

SCREEN: *Gospel/Psalm video, including different people each reading a line of Psalm 139 from The Inclusive Bible. Closing with a screen of all the different faces of the readers.*

Reader 1: **Hear the gospel according to John.**
Praise to you, O Lord.

Reader 1: **When Jesus arrived, he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days. When Jesus saw [Mary] weeping, and the Jews who came with her also weeping, he was greatly disturbed in spirit and deeply moved. He said, ‘Where have you laid him?’ They said to him, ‘Lord, come and see.’ Jesus began to weep. So the Jews said, ‘See how he loved him!’ But some of them said, ‘Could not he who opened the eyes of the blind man have kept this man from dying?’ Jesus, the anger again welling up within him, arrived at the tomb. It was a simple cave in the hillside with a slab of stone laid against it. Jesus said [to Martha],**

Jesus: “Remove the stone.”

Reader 2: “Master, by this time there’s a stench. He’s been dead four days!”

Jesus: (to her) “Didn’t I tell you that if you believed, you would see the glory of God?”

Jesus: (to all) “Go ahead, take away the stone.”

Reader 1: **They removed the stone. Jesus raised his eyes to heaven and prayed,**

Jesus: “Father, I’m grateful that you have listened to me. I know you always do listen, but on account of this crowd standing here I’ve spoken so that they might believe that you sent me.”

Reader 1: **Once he had said this, he cried with a loud voice,**

Jesus: “Lazarus, come out!”

Reader 1: **The dead man came out, his hands and feet bound with strips of cloth, and his face wrapped in a cloth.**

Voice #1: YHWH, you've searched me,
Voice #2: And you know me.
Voice #3: You created my inmost being
Voice #4: And stitched me together in my mother's womb.
Voice #5: For all these mysteries I thank you--
Voice #6: For the wonder of myself,
Voice #7: For the wonder of your works--
Voice #8: My soul knows it well.
Voice #9: My frame was not hidden from you
Voice #10: While I was being made in that secret place,
Voice #11: Knitted together in the depths of the earth;
Voice #12: Your eyes saw my body even there.
Voice #13: All of my days
Voice #14: Were written in your book,
Voice #15: All of them planned
Voice #16: Before even the first of them came to be.

Reader 1: Hear what the Spirit is saying to the church.
