Although our celebrations this year cannot be all that we would hope or want, I am grateful to God that we can still experience Christmas in the place that matters most. In our hearts and in our souls.


The miracle of the incarnation is more than some long distant event that we remember. It really can and must be part of our lived reality today!

Guidelines for Eastern Synod Congregations Holding Annual E-Meetings

The 2020 COVID-19 pandemic has forced congregations to consider alternatives to in person meetings when holding annual and congregational meetings. Whether holding an in person meeting, an electronic meeting, or no meeting at all, this document outlines a number of guidelines and things to consider as congregations plan for those events. At the same time, it also does not pretend to be a “how-to” process of holding a congregational meeting; as each congregation has its own traditions and practices, there is no “one size fits all.”

2020 YTD decline in Benevolence Offerings stabilizes in recent months

Financial Update (as of November 30th, 2020)

Over the entire eleven months of the year, benevolence offerings have decreased by 6% compared to the same period in 2019. In contrast, there has been a steady improvement in each of the last 3 months of 2020, compared with the corresponding month in 2019, from a decline of 14% in the month of September to a 4% decline in November. This stabilizing decline is a positive result considering we are now in our seventh month of the pandemic with a sense that there are still many more months of restrictions ahead.

Offerings designated for Canadian Lutheran World Relief saw a 50% decrease in November 2020 over November 2019, resulting in an overall decline of 25% on a year to date basis.

Even with a sense of several more months, perhaps even a year more, of living with the uncertainty of the pandemic, we still feel very grateful for the many members and congregations who are continuing to faithfully remit their offerings on a regular basis. The ministries that you support through your offerings have always been important, and as the pandemic continues, they are even more critical.

Christmas Videos Available



thirdspace_ partners with campus and community groups to ensure food for students

As the pandemic drove Luther and Wilfrid Laurier University students off campus in March, Laurier's food bank service was disrupted.

Yet many students who returned for the fall term continued to need help putting food on their tables. So thirdspace_ partnered with Laurier Students' Public Interest Research Group (LSPIRG) and the

Community Kitchen Co-operative KW, at Emmanuel United Church, to distribute food each week. About 60 students have been receiving groceries on Thursdays. The effort continues through the break. Students can sign up for a catered take-home meal for pick-up on Dec. 24.
