Effective November 1, 2021, all employees, contractors, volunteers and visitors to the Eastern Synod Office will be required to provide proof of full vaccination against COVID-19.

Paper, electronic or QR versions of government issued proof of vaccination will be accepted.

This policy is aligned with the employer's general duty under the *Occupational Health and Safety Act* to take every reasonable precaution to protect its workers (broadly defined) and the responsibility to assess the workplace for risks, including that of COVID-19 transmission.

This policy is applied in accordance with the *Ontario Human Rights Code*, *Occupational Health and Safety Act* and any other applicable legislation.

The Synod Office Team has now returned to in-office working patterns.

We welcome guests and visitors by appointment only.

We appreciate your ongoing willingness to contact the Synod Office prior to visiting.

Eastern Synod Office Vaccination Policy

The purpose of this policy is to outline expectations with regard to COVID-19 immunization of employees, contractors, volunteers and visitors when physically present in the Eastern Synod office.

Contingent upon vaccine availability and unless medically contraindicated, it is the expectation that all eligible employees, contractors, volunteers and visitors are fully vaccinated against COVID-19 (i.e. against infections caused by SARS-CoV-2).

This policy is aligned with the employer's general duty under the *Occupational Health and Safety Act* to take every reasonable precaution to protect its workers (broadly defined) and the responsibility to assess the workplace for risks, including that of COVID-19 transmission.

This policy is applied in accordance with the *Ontario Human Rights Code*, *Occupational Health and Safety Act* and any other applicable legislation.

Regardless of how often or how much time is spent in the Eastern Synod office, this policy applies to:

Employees

Contractors

Volunteers

Visitors

Effective November 1, 2021, all employees, contractors, volunteers and visitors will be required to provide one of the following:

Proof of COVID-19 vaccine administration as per the following requirements:

If the individual has only received the first dose of a two-dose COVID-19 vaccination series approved by Health Canada, proof that the first dose was administered and, as soon as reasonably possible, proof of administration of the second dose; or

Proof of all required doses of a COVID-19 vaccine approved by Health Canada

Written proof of a medical reason provided by either a physician or nurse practitioner that sets out:

That the person cannot be vaccinated against COVID-19; **and**

The effective time period for the medical reason (i.e. permanent or time-limited)

Employees, contractors, volunteers and visitors who cannot be vaccinated for medical reasons (as per 2 above), may be subject to additional requirements such as COVID-19 testing, redeployment, personal and public health protective measures, work exclusion/leave of absence, termination, or any further measures that may be deemed necessary based on the assessment by the employer of factors including for example, the work/role of the individual, the type of workplace, local epidemiology, etc., and in consideration of the duty to accommodate, as applicable.

This policy may change as the status of the pandemic changes and/or legislation or public health advice changes.

Policy Exceptions:

Exceptions are anticipated to be rare and can be made at the discretion of the Bishop and/or Director of Finance and Administration. Exceptions must be documented, maintained in a file and available for review by the Health and Safety representative.

2021 YTD-The (only?) Month of Giving Thanks Financial Update (as of October 31st, 2021)

With the celebration of the Thanksgiving holiday this month, it's that time of year when many people take a moment to think about what they are thankful for. It is refreshing to see that, as we have steered through the last eighteen or so months, that many are realizing that being grateful isn't just something to be felt in the month of October. As some studies have shown, developing an 'attitude of gratitude' is one of the simplest ways to improve your satisfaction with life. We, at the Eastern Synod, feel very grateful throughout the entire year for the many members and congregations who continue to faithfully remit their offerings.

Year to date benevolence offerings as of October 2021 was down from 2020 by almost 4%. The month of October 2021 was down over October 2020 by just over 14%.

Offerings designated for Canadian Lutheran World Relief that were received by the Synod office saw an increase of 75% over October 2020 largely due to a significant donation made by a congregation for a special appeal that didn't occur in 2020. There was an increase of 8% on a year to date basis.

Anglicans, Lutherans To Meet For Assembly In 2022

Delegates to the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada's National Convention and the Anglican Church of Canada's General Synod will gather together next July, for Assembly 2022.

Inspired by the theme Let there be Greening, delegates, special guests and partners will gather for worship, workshops, special presentations and business sessions.

The agenda for the shared meeting is in the process of being developed. The agenda will include time for meeting separately and for time together to explore and grow into the common life of our Full Communion relationship.

2021 marks the 20th anniversary of the signing of the Waterloo Declaration which brought the two churches into this Full Communion relationship. We may mutually share in each other's celebrations of the Eucharist, share liturgies, and Anglican and Lutheran clergy may serve in either church.

The Assembly 2022 theme will emphasize the importance of nurturing relationships, in particular the relationship between the two churches; with other partners; with one another; and with the Earth, alongside their role and responsibility as churches in the areas of social justice and advocacy.

The logo for Assembly 2022 includes a stylized image of the Earth with an abstract representation of leaves, trees and people. The layering of these elements references their interaction in relationship with one another.


