

### **Intergenerational Ecological Learning Activities:**

- Create a climate justice bulletin board for kids/all ages so they can share short stories, bible verses, or facts about their community.
- Car-free or car-pool week - encourage your members to walk, bike, take transit, or car pool to church together during Lent.
- Host a local foods potluck or meal to help each other think about how far our food has to travel and use fossil fuels in the process.
- One traditional Lenten discipline is fasting, so it's a good time to give up meat or reduce meat consumption during the season.
