ELCIC Women of Faith Fund

The ELCIC Women of Faith Fund provides annual grants that encourage and facilitate the Christ-centred ministry of women within the ELCIC and *In Mission for Others*.

This fund was established in 2011 in recognition of the “significant contribution of the women of the Evangelical Lutheran Women (ELW) of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada (ELCIC)”. The fund came from the monies remaining after the dissolution of the ELW. Individuals or groups may make additional donations to the fund.

Grants from the ELCIC Women of Faith Fund will be available on an annual basis. The **deadline for applications is MAY 1**.

Applicants will submit their proposals for review and consideration by the Women of Faith Fund Advisory Committee appointed by National Church Council.

At Synod Assembly last summer, when you passed Motion 1.4, you created a Racial Justice Advisory Committee to lead our Synod in the work of racial justice awareness, learning, and advocacy. Since then, your committee has been hard at work. Recently, all rostered ministers received a copy of the Working Toward Racial Justice workshop resource that was promised to you at Assembly. This resource can help open up space for conversations about race within congregations and ministry areas. If you haven't heard of an opportunity to participate in one of these workshops in your area, then talk to your pastor or Ministry Area Dean to get something started. As a way to remember to hold our sisters and brothers in the world in our hearts and prayers, pastors will also receive reminders and worship resources to include to mark the International day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination (March 21) and National Indigenous Peoples Day (June 21) this year and going forward. As a committee, we have been working on creating for ourselves a set of goals that will help us work toward a vision for God's Kingdom lived out

Workshop: Communications for Young Adults – May 4

Luther's communications director will be leading a workshop May 4 to help your congregation's young adults gain skills they can use to help publicize your church's events. In turn, we hope to help students gain skills they can use to fulfil the 40 volunteer hours required for high school graduation. The workshop is for students entering Grades 9, 10 or 11 in September. Each participant will learn how to make and execute a publicity plan for their congregation's events; create a flyer for one of their church's events; learn how to publicize the event in a comprehensive and co-ordinated way; hear how to pitch



their ideas to an audience of 1 or 100; and tour Luther's renewed building and Laurier's Waterloo campus. Cost \$20, includes refreshments and lunch, T-shirt and a certificate of completion.
