Fish And Tend

Some time ago I had a privilege to visit an elderly member of one of our congregations. We talked, prayed, sang and had Holy Communion. Many tears were shed. This elder had lost two family members in short time, hadn't been able to go to church for a long time, didn't get a pastor from the home congregation to bury the loved one, and hadn't been visited for years. For some reason this person had been dropped out from the pastoral care list. Even the person's regularly mailed offerings haven't got the pastor's attention. (This shows again how important it is that pastors know who is supporting the church by offerings.)

We are encouraged to find a renewed sense of mission to live out more fully our call to be the Church in mission for others. I remember praying in one of the Assembly services in 2014 with these words:

For the ministries of these congregations that have served you for years and now close their doors, we give you thanks. Walk with those who are finding new

faith communities. Embrace them when they feel a sense of loss. Bless their new ministries and service with a lively sense of call in mission for others. We pray in Jesus name, Amen.

Ideally the church is reaching out into the community, helping people who are in need, being voice to the voiceless, and serving those at the margins. The reality, however, is that we use maybe 90% of our time for inward services – on ourselves in other words.

This year, in part through a special grant from the ELCIC Church Extension Capital Fund, the Eastern Synod Mission Committee was able to significantly expand the breadth of its support for new congregational outreach ministries. *"We have lots of money we want to give you for creative and new mission initiatives!"* the mission committee proclaims on their webpage. <http://www.easternsynod.org/content/mission-committee> This year the Synod sponsors 40 new mission projects through this fund. Good news indeed!

When calling Peter and Andrew

to follow him, Jesus said "Follow me, and I will make you fish for people." If we want to catch fish, we have to **go** to fish, whether it's a lake, sea, river or pond. Fish don't come to our door to be caught. So, we are called to go out to meet people where they are.

At another time, at the breakfast on the beach Jesus again calls Peter – this time to take care of his flock. "Tend and feed my sheep", Jesus said.

While we are encouraged to seek new ways to do our ministry, actively "seeking other seas" as the song says, we should not neglect the ones who already are among us. Pastoral care in its very traditional form is still needed. Home, hospital, nursing home, prison visits are as important as they've always been.

A congregation which focuses solely on itself has no future. On the other hand, a congregation which does not lovingly care for its members is not attractive either. The challenge is to find a right balance between these two- inward and outward ministry.



Outdoor Ministry Is Alive

When Nobel Laureates are asked for the secret of their success, there is one common factor that seems to come up more than any other. It isn't smarts, although certainly they all have that in ready supply. It isn't perseverance, although they couldn't succeed without that, either. It's a person. A mentor. Someone who stood up for them along the way. Often it was a teacher. A chemistry teacher who left the lab door open so they could experiment after school hours. Or who encouraged their parents to send them to a faraway university to study at a higher level.

We all might name a similar person, who took us under their wing and made us better, more confident, and provided more opportunities for success. I've had several myself, experienced voices who have taught me how to be a better servant in the life of the Church, how to weather trials. One of those people was a camp counselor from my youth. I could always count on him to be there for me, and to accept me for who I was. He taught me that we all understand God in our unique way, and that we build a lasting faith out of that individual expression.

I am not alone in that camp experience. When I talk to people in our larger church family I am struck by the number of individuals who have mentors they have had to opportunity to meet through outdoor ministry. Each summer, I see that refreshed vision of faith playing out again in a new generation of campers.

Our camps, Edgewood, Lutherlyn, and Mush-a-Mush all provide that safe space for our youth and young adults to experience that voice of praise and acceptance. All three of our camps are gearing up for what will be an incredible summer. A place where mentors are found and lessons are learned. Lessons like tolerance for difference; openness to the possibility in others; kindness to strangers; the folly of hubris; the cost-and the gift-of sacrifice. These are important lessons taught by our first and foremost mentor—Jesus.

Give your youth and young adults the stillness of God's Backyard to find their mentor—to find themselves.

THE COUNTDOWN IS ON!

April 23 is the deadline for submission of nomination forms for those desiring to be on the ballot for election to the 2017 ELCIC National Convention.

Keep the following in mind:

- No signature is required for an endorsement (a contact number of the endorser is required, however).
- Each congregation may NOMINATE one person (in addition to a youth delegate, if applicable)
- an individual may ENDORSE more than one nominee
- One does **not** need to be a delegate to this year's Synod Assembly in order to be eligible for election to be a National Convention delegate. **All members of Eastern Synod congregations are eligible.**
- **The Eastern Synod will bear the cost of delegate fees etc;** the congregation does not need to take care of them.
