

Murray Scholarship

The **Murray Scholarship** was established in 2012. A donation was made by the congregation of Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church in New Hamburg, Ontario to create this scholarship in honour of their long-time organist, Ms. Murray. The purpose is to support students who are either studying music or are otherwise musically oriented. These funds are available for the school year 2018-2019.

Eligibility

The following general guidelines will apply to awards:

Recipients of awards from the Synod Scholarship Fund must **be members of Eastern Synod congregations** who are engaged in or about to engage in full-time post-secondary school studies. Students must be enrolled in a music program OR actively involved in music within their local congregation. Preference will be given to *first year* students.

The Selection Committee will consider the following factors:

- Christian character
- Financial need
- Vocational promise / Academic achievement
- Dedicated participation in the Church – specifically in the area of music
- Dedicated participation in the Community

Previous recipients of the Murray Scholarship are eligible to apply for subsequent grants.

Filing an Application

Each applicant will be responsible for ensuring that the following are submitted to the Selection Committee by the **deadline of Monday, May 14th, 2018**:

The enclosed **application form** with **Financial Statement**.

Two Letters of Reference. One letter should be from your pastor.

A photocopy of **transcripts** from your mid-term marks.

Successful applicants will receive **notification of awards by August 2018**. Awards will be paid at the beginning of October 2018, subject to verification of full-time enrollment.
